I am grateful to the ministry of *Open Doors – 'Serving the persecuted church' <u>www.opendoorsuk.org</u> for the resources that they have made available regarding the plight of suffering Christians around the world.*

Please remember our persecuted brothers and sisters around the world, for few others will!

DAILY BIBLE READING PLAN

The Holy Spirit is directing Kensington Temple London City Church to intensify our united and concentrated prayer. It is also imperative that we are in the Word and the Spirit on a daily basis and this prayer diary has a daily Bible reading plan that will take us right through February of next year.

This prayer diary is to fuel concentrated prayer at four levels of our church:

I. PERSONAL DAILY PRAYER AND BIBLE READING.

Every day we will be reading through the Bible together and praying for a particular aspect of our life and ministry.

II. CELL MINISTRY.

Cell leaders will encourage and monitor the use of this prayer diary in the life of the cell members and also use it for prayer in their cell meetings.

III. EARLY MORNING PRAYER MEETINGS.

Early morning prayer meetings are held at Kensington Temple at 6.30am-8.30am every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Leaders from our KTLCC network will be hosting these meetings and using the Autumn/Winter Prayer Diary to concentrate our prayers.

IV. WEDNESDAY EVENING PRAYER MEETINGS.

The Prayer diary will be used as fuel for our regular Wednesday Prayer meeting.

The pages before the Prayer diary and Bible reading plan will highlight some specific areas that we believe need concentrated prayer for the coming Autumn/Winter season.

Let us raise the levels of devotion, prayer and study of God's Word. This is the foundation upon which all God's plans for us depend.

TEN WAYS TO PRAY FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

1. For their physical protection and deliverance.

<u>Acts 12:5</u> "So Peter was kept in the prison, but prayer for him was being made fervently by the church to God."

<u>*Philippians 1:19*</u> "For I know that this shall turn out for my deliverance (from jail) through your prayers."

<u>*Philemon 22*</u> "I hope that through your prayers I shall be given to you (from jail)"

<u>*Romans 15:30-31*</u> "Now I urge you, brethren... to strive together with me in your prayers to God for me, that I may be delivered from those who are disobedient in Judea".

2. That God would give them the right words and that they would fearlessly make Christ known.

Ephesians 6:19-20 "Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should."

<u>Colossians 4:2-4</u> "Devote yourselves to prayer... praying at the same time for us as well, that God may open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned; in order that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak."

3. That they will see God's grace as sufficient and God's power perfected in their weakness.

<u>2 Corinthians 12:9-10</u> "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

4. That they would love Christ's appearing all the more.

<u>2 Timothy 4:5-8</u> "I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith; in the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day; and not only to me, but also to all who have loved His appearing." <u>Hebrews 11:35</u> "... others were tortured, not accepting their release, in order that they might obtain a better resurrection."

5. That they will rejoice in sharing the sufferings of Jesus so that they will rejoice even more when Christ is revealed.

<u>Hebrews 10:34</u> "...accepted joyfully the seizure of your property, knowing that you have for yourselves a better possession and an abiding one."

<u>Matthew 5:12</u> "Rejoice, and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

<u>1 Peter 4:13</u> "but to the degree that you share the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing; so that also at the revelation of His glory, you may rejoice with exultation."

6. That they will endure.

Hebrews 10:36 "For you have need of endurance."

7. That they will love their enemies.

<u>Luke 6:27-31</u> "But I say to you who hear, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."

8. That they will experience the joy of the Lord before their persecutors.

<u>Acts 16:25</u> "But about midnight Paul and Silas (in jail) were praying and singing hymns of praise to God, and the prisoners were listening to them."

<u>*Philippians 1:28*</u> "…in no way alarmed by your opponents—which is a sign of destruction for them, but of salvation for you, and that too, from God."

9. That they will remember their unbelievable future glory.

<u>Romans 8:18</u> "For I consider that the sufferings of the present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us."

10. That they would learn to more completely trust in God.

<u>2 Corinthians 1:8-9</u> "For we do not want you to be unaware, brethren, of our affliction which came to us in Asia, that we were burdened excessively, beyond our strength, so that we despaired even of life; indeed, we had the sentence of death within ourselves in order that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God who raises the dead".

VICTORY

2014 WORLD WATCH LIST

Every day millions of Christians are persecuted because of their faith. The World Watch List ranks the 50 countries where persecution is most severe. Worldwide, the list reports that pressure on Christians intensified in 2013. The situation deteriorated most rapidly across North Africa, the Middle East and the Gulf, in countries where sectarian violence has advanced unchecked by impotent central governments.

When you ask persecuted Christians what they need, almost without exception they answer, "Prayer." Prayer is the one thing that border guards and religious police cannot keep out. Prayer reaches the most remote villages and infiltrates the most inaccessible labour camps. Prayer changes things. The church is shaken, bruised, grieving. But the church is growing. The church is enduring. The church is alive. And the church needs our prayer.

The World Watch List is based on detailed information provided by *Open Doors* co-workers in over 65 countries, as well as independent experts (please see opendoorsuk.org for more details). Data is gathered on five spheres of life – private, family, community, national and church life - plus a sixth sphere measuring the degree of violence. Of course the levels of persecution in any of these 50 nations may suddenly intensify at any time.

NORTH KOREA

Leader: Kim Jong-un Population: 24.5 million (300,000 Christians) Main Religion: Atheism/traditional beliefs Government: Communist dictatorship World Watch List Rank: 1

Sources of Persecution: Communist oppression Dictatorial paranoia





For the 12th consecutive year, this is the place where Christian persecution is most extreme. The god-like worship of the leader, Kim Jong-un, and his predecessors leaves no room for any other religion and Christians face unimaginable pressure in every sphere of life. Forced to meet only in secret, they dare not share their faith even with their families, for fear of imprisonment in a labour camp. Anyone discovered engaging in clandestine religious activity may be subject to arrest, arbitrary detention, disappearance, torture, even public execution.



Persecution dynamics

North Korea is in a league of its own when it comes to the persecution of Christians. The rule of Kim Jong-un and his Workers' Party is absolute and strict. No one is allowed or able to challenge or question this rule. The party's ideology is based on Communist ideas and is inextricably tied with a dominant personality cult. The country 'exists' to serve the leaders, and all forms of worship not concentrated on the Kim dynasty are seen as dangerous and state-threatening. Christians face the highest imaginable pressure. All Christians are classified as 'hostile' and even considered to be a separate 'subclass'. Christians whose faith is discovered are sent to political labour camps from which release is not possible.

- Pray for the 50,000-70,000 Christians imprisoned in labour camps. Ask God to sustain them
- Pray that God would change the heart of Kim Jong-un and use him to reform the country
- Pray for protection for co-workers and contacts providing relief and shelter for Christians refugees in China.

SOMALIA




Leader: President Hassan Sheikh Mohamud

Population: 10.3 million (A few hundred Christians)

Main Religion: Islam

Government: Federal republic

World Watch List Rank: 2



Pressure is increasing on the tiny Christian community in this Muslimmajority country. Islamic leaders and government officials publicly state that there is no room for Christians, and there is a strong drive to purge Christianity from Somalia. The militant Islamist group, al-Shabaab, targets Christians and radicalises local communities. Ten believers are reported to have been killed by members of al-Shabaab in 2013. There is a high level of fear and mistrust among believers, who have to hide their faith for fear of betrayal.





The majority of people in Somalia are Muslim, and no one is expected to be a Christian. The tiny Christian minority is made up mostly of converts from a Muslim background, and a very few expat aid workers. Islamic religious leaders maintain publicly that there is no room for Christianity, Christians or churches in Somalia.

The violent Islamist terrorist group, al-Shabaab, subscribes to the Wahhabist doctrine and advocates Sharia (Islamic law) as the basis from which to regulate all aspects of life, whether legal, political, social or economic. Al-Shabaab's implementation of its Wahhabist worldview is so extreme that, according to a local researcher, even Sufi Muslims have moved underground to avoid persecution at their hands.

Muslim-background believers - or those accused of being Muslimbackground believers - have often been killed on the spot when discovered. Ordinary citizens - in collaboration with al-Shabaab - have been involved in the killing of Christians. One researcher stated that, "Believers have been betrayed into the hands of al-Shabaab by their neighbours..."

- Praise God that, despite the pressures, He has preserved a Christian witness in Somalia
- Pray for the very few, often isolated believers. Ask God to provide ways for them to mature in Christ
- Pray that Christians would have more freedom to worship Jesus.

SYRIA

- Leader: President Bashar al-Assad Population: 21.8 million (1.3 million Christians) Main Religion: Islam Government: Republic World Watch List Rank: 3
- Source of Persecution: Islamic extremism





As the civil conflict inside Syria becomes more and more sectarian, targeted violence against Christians has escalated. The Syrian opposition is increasingly 'Islamising' and Christians are becoming more vulnerable in all spheres of life. Many Christians were reported to have been abducted, physically harmed or killed, and many churches damaged or destroyed. On 21st October 2013, Islamist militias invaded the ancient Christian settlement of Sadad, killing at least 45 people and injuring many more.



Persecution dynamics

The civil war which began as a popular uprising in 2011, with demands for increased political liberties and economic reforms, has rapidly evolved into an extremely violent sectarian conflict. Last year, Open Doors received many reports of Christians being abducted, physically harmed and killed. Many churches are damaged or destroyed, in many cases deliberately.

Yet amidst all violence and persecution, there are also sparks of hope. Though many Christians have left the country or are internally displaced, there is growth in numbers of Christians as well as people have converted to Christ in this deplorable situation of civil war. One pastor recently told an Open Doors co-worker: "We have prayed for a revival for years and now it's here, but we never expected that God would use a civil war."

- Pray for protection for the many believers who have chosen to stay in Syria to serve their communities
- Pray for workers and partners bring relief to thousands of displaced Christian families
- Pray for a peaceful end to the conflict that has torn this country apart.

IRAQ

Leader: Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi Population: 35.9 million (330,000 Christians) Main Religion: Islam Government: Parliamentary democracy World Watch List Rank: 4

Source of Persecution: Islamic extremism

Iraq is a country in crisis. In June 2014 the Sunni militant group ISIS (now known as Islamic State) attacked Mosul, Iraq's second largest city. The goal of Islamic State is to create a Caliphate - an ultra-Islamic state - in Iraq and Syria. Although the attackers were relatively few in number, the Iraqi army fled, leaving the militant jihadists to take control of the city. The result was a mass exodus of thousands of citizens: up to 500,000 according to some estimates. Those leaving included virtually all of Mosul's remaining Christian population. Taking only what they could carry, most Christians fled to the relatively safe Kurdish region. As refugees they are living in extreme hardship. Islamic State is not the only group which seeks to empty the country of Christians. Violence, death and mistreatment for Christians is common. And they are an easy target for kidnappers.







Persecution dynamics

Since the US-led invasion of Iraq in 2003, the situation has been continuously deteriorating, with anti-Western (and as such anti-Christian) sentiments mounting and levels of violence by Islamist militants on the increase. Islamist terrorist groups are increasing in number in the north, under the influence of the civil war in Syria. ISIS is the most violent and extreme of these movements: its brutal tactics and extreme interpretation of Islamic law have alienated other rebel groups, and even al-Qaeda.

- Pray for those fleeing the fighting in Mosul and the many thousands of displaced Christians within the country
- Pray for Muslim-background believers who often face opposition from their family and community
- Pray for workers supporting displaced Christians with trauma counselling, biblical training and income generating projects.

AFGHANISTAN



Leader: President Hamid Karzai

Population: 35.6 million (thousands of Christians)

Main Religion: Islam

Government: Islamic republic

World Watch List Rank: 5

Sources of Persecution: Islamic extremism Tribal antagonism



The situation in the country remains unstable and Islamic extremist groups continue to gain power. Christianity is still considered a 'Western' religion and is seen as hostile to Afghan culture, society and Islam. Those who leave Islam are treated as apostates and face huge pressure from family, society and local authorities. There is no public church, even for expats. Christian converts keep their faith secret, since any connection with Christianity is dangerous. In September 2013, an Afghan MP called for the execution of converts to Christianity.



Persecution dynamics

In recent years, tension has increased for Christians in Afghanistan as the government and society as a whole has embraced a strict form of Islam and does not accept any form of Christianity. Consequently, Christians have been pushed deep underground.

All Afghan Christians come from a Muslim background. If their conversion to Christianity is discovered, they will be put under huge pressure to recant their faith, both from Muslim clergy and local authorities. Tribal values are deeply entrenched and anyone who embraces something new and maybe even foreign will be looked at as a traitor and excluded from the community. The Christian religion is still considered to be a Western religion and, as such, hostile to Afghan culture, society and Islam.

- All Afghan Christians come from a Muslim background and are at risk if their faith is discovered. Ask God to protect and encourage them
- The Taliban continue to threaten and attack Afghan citizens. Pray that their influence will diminish
- Pray that the withdrawal of international forces in 2014 will not lead to a return to civil war.

SAUDI ARABIA





Leader: King Abdullah

Population: 29.9 million (1.25 million Christians)

Main Religion: Islam

Government: Monarchy

World Watch List Rank: 6

Source of Persecution: Islamic extremism

The open practice of any religion other than Islam is forbidden here and conversion to another faith is punishable by death. Most Christians are expats from Asia or Africa. During 2013, several Christian migrant fellowships were raided by police and many worshippers were detained and deported. Muslim-background believers run the risk of honour killing if their faith is discovered. Yet a small but growing number of Muslims are coming to Christ and sharing their faith on the internet and satellite TV.



Persecution dynamics


This desert kingdom controls the Islamic holy cities of Mecca and Medina (birth and resting place of Muhammad, the prophet of Islam) and is defined by Wahhabism, a purist and strict interpretation of Islam. Extremists are widely present in the kingdom. Saudi funding of terrorism outside the country is the main source of Sunni terrorism in the world.

Most Christians here are expatriates who live and work temporarily in the country. The majority are from India and the Philippines, others are from Africa and the West. Christian Asian and African workers, besides being exploited and poorly paid, are regularly exposed to verbal and physical violence also because of their faith. Although slavery has been illegal in Saudi Arabia since 1962, the Saudi employer or 'sponsor' has a tremendous amount of power over foreign workers, showing that there is still a mentality of 'owning foreign workers'. Migrant domestic workers are even threatened with rape unless they convert to Islam.

- Widespread unemployment and increasing discontent amongst young people makes this a breeding ground for extremists. Ask God to halt the spread of extremist views
- Pray that more Muslims will meet Jesus through satellite TV or dreams and visions of Jesus
- In 2013, two men were convicted of proselytising and sentenced to a few hundred lashes and several years in prison. Pray for their release.

MALDIVES

Leader: President Abdulla Yameen Population: 333,000 (Several Christians) Main Religion: Islam Government: Republic World Watch List Rank: 7



To be Maldivian is equated with being Muslim, so officially there are no Maldivian Christians, only expat Christians. The government sees itself as the protector of Islam and the law prohibits conversion to other faiths; those who do so face losing citizenship. There is extensive social control over all individuals to correct any deviation from the path of Islam. This pressure is mirrored within families and communities. Consequently, there are no church gatherings or buildings and the few Maldivian Christians hide their faith to avoid being discovered.







Persecution dynamics

Christianity in the Maldives is split into groups of expat Christians and a very small group of local Christians. They are victims of every kind of persecution and driven deeply underground. There is extensive social control to keep watch over every individual to correct any deviation from the path of Islam. The official import of Scriptures and Christian literature is impossible. Even tourists have reported getting into trouble having a personal copy of the Bible with them.

As the population density is extremely high, there is virtually no privacy. Christians face huge pressure from both family and community. Consequently, there are no church gatherings and buildings in the Maldives and Christians take every precautionary measures possible to avoid being discovered. Some Christians who were discovered had to flee abroad. In one case, a wife was heavily beaten and abused when her husband discovered her conversion.

- Pray for encouragement and fellowship for the very few believers, who are extremely isolated Christian literature is forbidden. Pray that doors will open to God's Word.
- Pray that the new president, elected in November 2013, will bring greater freedom to the people of these islands.

PAKISTAN



Leader: Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif Population: 186.4 million (5.3 million Christians) Main Religion: Islam Government: Republic

World Watch List Rank: 8

Sources of Persecution: Islamic extremism Organised corruption

Pakistan's Christians are caught in the crossfire between Islamic militant organisations that routinely target Christians, and an Islamising culture that leaves Christians isolated from the rest of the population. The notorious blasphemy laws continue to have devastating consequences for minorities, including Christians. Women and girls from minority groups are particularly vulnerable and sexual assaults against underage Christian girls by Muslim men continue to be reported. In September 2013, a twin bomb attack on Anglican All Saints Church in Peshawar left 89 people dead.



Persecution dynamics

There are three types of Christianity in Pakistan: traditional churches such as Catholics or Anglicans, non-traditional protestant groups, and Christian converts from a Muslim background. Muslim background believers, if discovered, face strong opposition and so keep their conversion secret or even relocate for security reasons. But if a rumour of blasphemy spreads, mobs frequently target Christians without caring about denominations.

Suspicion and bias are high and it is always dangerous to keep Christian materials in one's house as allegations of blasphemy can be raised on any occasion. Those allegations frequently turn out to be raised just for the sake of settling personal scores. This results in Christians having to act with extreme caution.


Churches still can meet and work unhindered, but they are monitored and services are sometimes interrupted and attacked.

- Many Christians who can afford to are leaving the country. Ask God to give His people courage to remain as a witness to their nation
- Pray for Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, elected in 2013. Ask God to move him to take action to defend the rights of Christians and other minority groups
- Pray for protection for young Christian girls who are particularly at risk of abduction or assault.

IRAN

- Leader: Ayatollah Ali Khamenei Population: 77.2 million (450,000 Christians) Main Religion: Islam Government: Islamic republic World Watch List Rank: 9
- Source of Persecution: Islamic extremism

Since Ayatollah Ali Khamenei's warning in 2010 of the ever-expanding influence and numbers of house churches, the treatment of Christians has rapidly worsened. The regime tries to destroy those who reach out to converts and seekers by monitoring services, arresting converts, banning Farsi language services and closing some churches. Attacks against Christian communities have increased and the prohibition of house church activities is enforced more strictly. Yet the regime's harsh treatment of Christians only further fuels the flames of church growth.







Persecution dynamics

Persecution of religious minorities has intensified in Iran since 2005. This is particularly aimed at the Baha'i, Dervishes - a Sufi religious order - and Christians, especially converts from Islam. According to the state, only Armenians and Assyrians can be Christian. Ethnic Persians are by definition Muslim, therefore ethnic Persian Christians are by definition apostates. This makes almost all Christian activity illegal, especially when it occurs in Persian language - from evangelism to Bible training, to publishing Scripture and Christian books or preaching in Farsi.

Christians are seen as a particular threat to the regime as their numbers are growing and it is said that children of political and spiritual leaders are leaving Islam for Christianity. In general a large proportion of society is tired of the system and sees its failings after 30 years.

- Preaching, evangelism and publishing Christian books in the Farsi language is illegal. Pray for protection for those seeking to spread God's Word inside the country
- It is said that children of political and spiritual leaders are leaving Islam for Christianity. Pray that more Muslims will discover the truth of the gospel.
- At least 40 Christians are in prison for their faith. Ask the Lord to sustain them.

YEMEN

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Leader: President Abdrabbuh Mansour Hadi

- Population: 27.2 million (a few thousand Christians)
- Main Religion: Islam
- **Government: Republic**
- World Watch List Rank: 10
- Source of Persecution: Islamic extremism

There is some religious freedom for foreigners here but evangelism is prohibited and Yemenis who leave Islam may face the death penalty. Muslim-background believers are forced to meet in secret. If their faith is discovered, they face severe persecution from authorities, family, and extremist groups who threaten 'apostates' with death if they do not recant. Insecurity caused by Islamist movements makes Yemen very unstable. Christians are believed to be under surveillance by extremists and expat Christians can be a specific target for these extremist groups.



Persecution dynamics

Yemen is very unstable and its situation has deteriorated since the Arab Spring riots of 2011. The country is balancing on the brink of civil war. In the chaos, Al-Qaeda militants have seized the opportunity to spread to parts of Yemen where formerly the government maintained some sort of order. These developments have led to an increase in oppression of Christians.

Kidnappings of foreigners occur regularly, and Christians are believed to be under surveillance by extremists. Several expat Christians have been kidnapped, though it is hard to discern to what extent religious factors play a role. Migrant Christian fellowships have been raided and forced to stop meeting.

- The number of local believers in Yemen is estimated at just a few hundred. Ask the Lord to encourage them and increase their numbers
- Several expat Christians have been kidnapped in recent years. Pray for protection for foreign Christian workers and NGOs
- Al-Qaeda-linked groups are gaining more power. Pray that Yemen's leaders will be able to restore peace to this deeply divided country.


EVANGELISM OF 3

Unless we keep evangelism as our primary purpose, the cell groups easily slip into the comfort of being only Christian fellowship meetings.

That is why we centre all cell group activity on what we call the Evangelism of 3. Prayer triplets are not new, but they are an effective way of involving every single cell member to win people to Christ.

We begin by asking cell members to make a list of 10 people whom they know, meet regularly and can invite to the cell meetings. Then we focus on 3 people the Holy Spirit shows us on each of these lists. Joining with 2 or 3 other people, we begin to pray daily for those on our shortlists. Regular cell meetings will include time for prayer and strategic planning, in order to win these precious people for Christ. The cells then organise their meetings and activities around the goal of reaching their friends with the gospel.


Write down up to ten names of people you are in regular contact with in London that don't know Christ and pray for their salvation each day.



If you don't have a full ten ask God to show you new people to befriend.

Each month ask the Holy Spirit which three people you should specially reach out to that month and write their names down. Your cell leader will help you in this.

KENSINGTON TEMPLE DAILY PRAYER AND BIBLE READING DIARY

"And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayer". Acts 2:42

A people with a passion can only sustain the fire of the Holy Spirit through the fuel of God's Word, prayer and fellowship.

1) Daily Bible reading

"But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that is proceeding out of the mouth of God" Matthew 4:4

If you don't eat good food on a daily basis you will grow weak and ineffective in everything you do. Likewise if you don't feed on God's Word daily you will be spiritually weak and unable to cope not only with the call to be a disciple but even with normal everyday daily challenges. We have put a daily Bible reading plan in this booklet that will take you through the Bible in a year. It is one of the most popular Bible reading plans of all time devised by the great revivalist Robert Murray M'Cheyne.

Start on whatever day you first receive this booklet so that we can all read the same word together each day. If for some reason you miss a day or a few days just re-join the plan again according to the actual date, don't try to catch up what you have missed and don't give up - be steadfast. This is about regular Bible reading. Expect God to speak to you during your reading. Use bookmarks in your Bible/Bible apps for ease of daily reference.

Encourage one another in this in your cells each week.

2) Consistent, concentrated, effective prayer!

Colin has already explained to us how this booklet is to be used in prayer (see pages 2-3).

Each day before prayer say out loud the Victory and Protection declarations on pages 6 and 7. You will notice how this sets your mind for victory each day and causes your praying to be mixed with faith and expectation. The prayer diary is meant to be repeated each month right through to the end of January 2015.

A good way to pray each day is by using the acronym ACTS:

Adoration: Praise God for who he is, Proclaim his goodness. Pour worship upon him.

Confession: Remind yourself of your need for him and reliance on him. Keep short accounts with God. Ask him to forgive you and make sure you forgive others each day. Don't dwell negatively on this though; get right with God and your fellow man and then move on!

Thanksgiving: Thank him for specific things that he has done, and thank him for what you believe he is going to do in faith.

Supplication: Come to God with your needs and the needs of London and the world and pray for the daily items on the prayer diary.

We also strongly advise you to pray in tongues for 15-20 minutes a day to build yourself up and get victory for your day!

PRAYER DIARY

Day 1:

Speak out with faith the daily confession on pages 6-7. Pray for Colin and Amanda Dye and all the leaders of KTLCC for unity, vision, wisdom and success. Don't forget your daily prayer for the Evangelism of 3 (see pages 30-31).

Lay your hands on all the 100 persecuted nations on page 8-9. Lift them up by name to the Lord. Pause on any nation the Holy Spirit leads you to focus on.

Day 2:

Pray for all Christians involved in politics and education and especially those involved in the KT forum. Pray for the Prime Minster, London Mayor, those in national and your local government. Check the news today and pray for anything important going on in Parliament.

Pray for the persecuted church in North Korea according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 10-11.

Day 3:

Pray for the ministry of the evangelism and the miraculous to multiply throughout our cells, churches and all our missions work. Pray for the new Evangelistic Cells that are being launched – that they would win and consolidate many new believers. Pray for all new cell leaders.

Pray for the persecuted church in Somalia according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 12-13.

Day 4:

Pray for all the churches in London and all Christian leaders in our capital from all denominations. Pray that God would guide them and use them for his glory. Pray especially for the cell leaders and church leaders of KTLCC. Pray for God's blessing on their family, ministry and finances.

Pray for the persecuted church in Syria according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 14-15.

Day 5:

Pray for all the young adults, youth and children in KTLCC that God would use them to win and disciple a new generation in London. Pray for all our young people in cells that God would give them great favour at school and form them into mighty men and women of God!

Pray for the persecuted church in Iraq according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 16-17.

Day 6:

Pray for the work of Christians and the gospel in the media and the arts. Pray that these areas would be increasingly used to the glory of God and the presentation of the gospel. Pray for moral strength to be given to Christians who are called to this area that they would stand out and not compromise. Pray for all KT people involved in this area.

Pray for the persecuted church in Afghanistan according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 18-19.

Day 7:

Pray for the manifestation of the sons and daughters of the latter house to arise in KT (Haggai 2:9). Ask the Lord for the generation to arise to fulfil this prophetic verse regarding KT.

Pray for the persecuted church in Saudi Arabia according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 20-21.

Day 8:

Pray for our vision for the French-speaking nations of Africa. Pray for our Bible school in Marseille. Pray for David and Christine Thabot who lead the Temple de Paris and the persecution and opposition they face from the local mayor.

Pray for the persecuted church in the Maldives according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 22-23.

Day 9:

Pray for our TV ministry that reaches millions in North Africa, the Middle East and Indonesia. Pray for the new programmes we wish to make for them. Pray that millions of Muslims would be converted in the next few years worldwide. Pray for the true nature of Islam and the Qur'an to be revealed in the media and in politics.

Pray for the persecuted church in Pakistan according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 24-25.

Day 10:

Pray for the Elim Pentecostal churches across Britain, of which we are part, that they would multiply and be effective for the gospel. Pray for the National Leadership Team that they would have wisdom and courage in leading our movement.

Pray for the persecuted church in Iran according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 26-27.

Day 11:

Pray into the Giant of Influence regarding Marriage and Family. Pray that the biblical view of marriage and the family would be strengthened in our nation. Pray for all marriages and families in KTLCC. Pray all for God's grace to be with all single parents and their children in our church. Pray also for singles seeking to find their life partner.

Pray for the persecuted church in Yemen according to the Prayer Fuel on pages 28-29.

Day 12:

Pray for the preaching and teaching of KTLCC. Ask God to give great revelation, authority and power in the pulpits of our house to break strongholds, set captives free releasing people into their destiny. Pray by name for preachers that you know in our network. Pray for God's blessing on Dr RT Kendall as he joins us again for six months in 2015.

Pray for the persecuted church in Northern Nigeria – for strength and deliverance from Boko Haram terrorists. Pray for Nigerian Government to be stable and to address the persecution. Pray for the church in the South to remember the church in the North and help them.

Day 13:

Pray for all our members involved in medicine and healthcare. Pray that God's love and healing would flow through their words and actions. Pray for the end of abortion on demand and that our nation would appreciate that human life starts at conception. Pray against assisted suicide and euthanasia which would put so many vulnerable people at risk.

Pray for the persecuted church in Algeria. Ask God to strengthen Muslim-background believers who are often rejected by family and friends. Pray for the church planting amongst the Kabyle people that our cells support in prayer and finance. Pray for Pastor Youssef, their leader, and his family.

Day 14:

Pray for all for all those involved in the Giant of Education and Training, for wisdom and favour on their lives and that God will use them as salt and light right where they are.

Pray for your Evangelism of 3 by name and seek the Lord for prophetic insight into their lives.

Day 15:

Lift up all KT street outreach teams and local London missions to the throne of God. Pray for the healing teams that go out on the streets praying for the sick and witnessing boldly about Christ.

Pray for the church in Europe as increasing pressure and persecution arises from secularism and Islamic sources. Pray for a breakthrough for the gospel in Europe and a new Reformation to take place.

Day 16:

Pray for the vision given to us in the 1980s that people would come to KT as hearers of the Word and go out into the world as doers of the Word. Pray for our cell vision to prosper. Pray for new cells and new cell leaders. Encourage one another in the Evangelism of 3 and press in for new souls in the cells.

Pray for the persecuted church in Malaysia. Pray for Prime Minister Razak to be more tolerant towards the small Christian minority. Pray for new doors of opportunity for the gospel to be preached.

Day 17:

Pray for a new generation of leaders in the church of Europe to arise that would turn the tide of unbelief and bring forth revival. Pray that God would use KT to help bring revival to London, Europe and the world.


