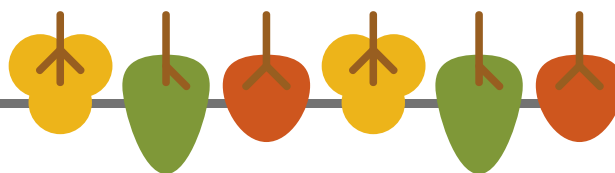

I couldn't be more grateful to all the enthusiastic team we have, who work tirelessly behind the scenes!

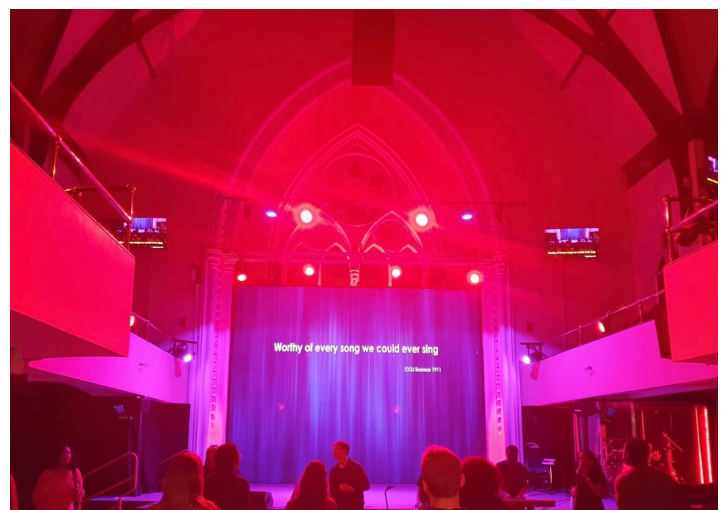
## ENERGISE
